

Title: Bolstering S&T Policy Credentials through the Journal of Science Policy and Governance

Description: For nearly 10 years, the Journal of Science Policy and Governance, a non-profit organization and peer review journal, has served as a vehicle for students, postdocs, policy fellows, and early career researchers of all academic backgrounds to bolster their research and writing credentials around every corner of science, technology, and innovation policy debate ranging from climate change to emerging technologies. JSPG is managed by and for early career researchers. Issues are peer-reviewed, published on an accelerated timeline in open-access formats that are accessible to policy and public audiences. JSPG publications range from 1500 word op-eds to 35 page technology assessments.
